New Peace of Mind for your parents thanks to the launch of Contact4Me a new personal emergency database....

In everyday life the unexpected can happen. Yet we rarely carry the necessary information to identify our friends and family. Contact4Me allows you to store up to ten telephone numbers (including your doctor's details) and any medical alerts in your very own secure personal database. This information can be accessed immediately by the dedicated Contact4Me call centre, or directly via the internet, by the emergency services, or an individual that comes to your aid after an emergency occurrence.

Sue and Steven Salik, owners of Contact4Me, learnt the hard way of the importance of knowing they can be contacted if their loved ones are in situations of emergency, when their daughter was caught up in the 7/7 Kings Cross terrorist attack. Mercifully she was unharmed, but this event, coupled with the experience of Sue's mother suffering from dementia

was so distressing, that they decided to launch Contact4Me as a result.

Sue Salik says "Contact4Me membership is essential for providing peace of mind and is suitable for everyone, regardless of their age or where they live. Our service is accessible worldwide and all contacts can be modified in real time. You can rest assured that you are never alone when carrying your Contact4Me ID".
